Birds See many rare and endemic forest and seabirds.

Twice Weekly – Watch the National Park team feed young or injured birds to re-introduce into the wild. Maybe see the rare Abbott's Booby. (free)

Bird and Nature Week
27 August – 3 September

Join researchers and natural history experts for a week-long immersion in birds and wildlife. Find the elusive Christmas Island Hawk Owl.

Reptiles Home to five endemic reptiles: two are in a breeding program for eventual release.

Weekly Tour the Research Station to see the endemic Blue-Tailed Skink and Lister's Gecko (free)

Lizard Census
July 16-23 and July 23-30

Work along side the National Park team to count the critically endangered Blue-Tailed Skinks and Lister's Geckos and rebuild their home.

Oceans Experience, the warm azure waters rich in colourful corals and fish.

Marine Debris Collection and Audit
June 21-28

Volunteers and locals, collect and audit marine debris from the Island's beaches. In 2018 over 140,000 items, weighing 4000kg collected.

Celebrate our Seas - Underwater Film Festival, Turtles walk and talk, diving, early morning swims information sessions and more.
